Summary of the Revised Neonatal Resuscitation Guidelines

- The 2017 NRP guidelines recommend a 30- to 60-second delay in clamping in all term and preterm infants not requiring resuscitation. - If the placental circulation is disrupted (e.g., placental abruption), the cord should be clamped immediately.
